### **SUPERVISOR COMMENTS**

An avalanche of report calls hit tonight's shift, with officers pulling 23 reports. Through the night, we made two arrests out of domestic violence investigations and arrested four more people for various warrants. Officers also made two shoplifting arrests, one of which was of a juvenile boy for stealing liquor from a business on the 1600 block of Lander Ave. As the night wore on, officers detained a man for a mental health evaluation after he threatened staff at the group home he lives in. Officers also investigated what was reported as a violation of a court order, but turned out to be a criminal threats incident where a man threatened to shoot his ex-girlfriend. Finally, officers were dispatched to the 1400 block of Colorado Avenue to check on a man who dialed 9-1-1. He was found to be highly intoxicated and unable to care for himself.
