Our first day of this work week was busy, with the calls starting right after briefing. During the day, officers responded to calls that resulted in several people being taken to jail and juvenile hall. Officers responded to a subject who arrived at his employment intoxicated. He refused to leave and ended up being arrested for public intoxication. In another incident, officers responded to a neighbor dispute in which one neighbor was intoxicated and
