Dayshift started out slow for calls for service allowing officers to catch up on their reports from the busy shift the day before. Officers responded to a residence where a female reporting she was assaulted by her boyfriend. She had a warrant for her arrest and would not meet the officer because she did not want to get arrested. She was not very cooperative in the investigation. A report was sent to the District Attorney's Office for review of the case. Officers were dispatched to a residence for a possible suicidal male. Based on the evidence and the comments the male had been making, the Officer detained him for his own safety and transported him to a hospital for a mental evaluation. An Officer also followed up on a security check at a residence from the day before and met with CPS at a residence. CPS was able to aid a mother and her children. Today was the Fourth of July car show along with the Farmer's Market downtown. It was a relatively large turn out with no reported calls for service for it. An Officer on bike patrol also worked during this event.

Our last day of this work week wasn't as busy as the few previous. This gave officers time to complete previous reports and make several traffic stops. Officers handled a hit & run accident today in the north end of town. Very little information was obtained on the responsible vehicle. No injuries were reported. Officers also contacted a suspicious subject and discovered that he had an outstanding warrant. He was arrested for the warrant. During the middle of the shift, TPD received a call of a missing adult female. She was in her 50's, but had the mental capacity of a 7-yr. old. Her mother stated she was missing for an hour and was very worried. Multiple officers began to canvas the area and surrounding retail spaces. She was located about ¾ mile away from the home and said she had run away. She was taken home and her family was very grateful for our response to this incident.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was a steady night for the graveyard shift. Officers responded to a security check of a male who was heavily intoxicated and called police stating he was going to go home and beat his wife and son. because they will not give him any money. Officers determined he was not in condition to care for himself or make good decisions based on his level of intoxication. He was arrested and booked. An officer contacted a male for a TMC violation. The male provided a false name and claimed he was 18 years old, although his appearance was not in line with that age. Eventually his identity was found and he was 45 years old. He was arrested for giving a false name and unlawful camping. Officers also responded to a security check and came across a 16-year-old who was a runaway from San Bernardino. An officer had to sit with the juvenile for hours waiting for CPS, as the parent was unable to respond for several hours. Officers also responded to a hit & run accident after a vehicle collided into a city fence and caused a large amount of damage. All of the occupants in the vehicle were seen running away by witnesses after the crash. Officers checked the area and did not locate them. Bottles of alcohol were found in the vehicle, along with a female's purse. At the time of this log, no suspects have been identified.
