SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer made a traffic stop and saw drug paraphernalia in plain view. A further search of the vehicle revealed numerous baggies containing a white powdery substance believed to be cocaine inside, along with a scale and other evidence related to drug sales. The investigation led to the driver's arrest for drug sales and transportation. Officers responded to an assault & battery between brothers. One brother was intoxicated and decided to hit the other brother. The victim wanted to press charges and an arrest was made. After the arrest, the suspect began making threats to the officer, stating that he was going to shoot him, and punch him on the mouth. He was booked for the battery and threats to the officer. Several officers also responded to an injury hit & run accident. The suspect fled on foot after the collision and was not located. Hours later, the investigating officer located an intoxicated male walking in the area of where the collision had occurred. The male was determined to have ties to the vehicle involved in the accident, paperwork with his name on it was also found in the vehicle; however, there were no witnesses who could identify him as the driver involved in the crash and no other evidence indicated that he was the driver. He was arrested and booked for public intoxication at this time.
