The driver had a warrant out of Modesto for resisting arrest. He was cited for his traffic violations, booked for his warrant, and his car was towed. Officers assisted the SRO at PHS for a fight after school, involving 3 female juveniles. It resulted in an arrest of the female who started the fight for assault/battery.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Street Crimes officers contacted a known parolee and conducted a search on him and his cell phone. The cell phone had evidence of text messages indicative of drug sales. Officers went to the motel room where the parolee was staying and did a search. In the room they located a bag of Fentanyl, empty packaging and a scale. The male was arrested for drug sales and a parole violation was attached to the booking charges. Another officer made a traffic stop and arrested the driver for a warrant. An officer also investigated a felony battery involving domestic violence. There were several incidents reported that recently occurred in Turlock and in other areas of Stanislaus County. The Sheriff's Department assisted by going to the suspects residence in the county jurisdiction to try and locate the suspect for an arrest. An I&B was completed and an arrest has not been made at this time.
