SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The day after Christmas was more eventful than we hoped for. The morning started out with two commercial burglaries, one completed and one attempted. The suspects chose two businesses with lock boxes on their front doors, cut open the lock boxes to gain entry to the key to the business, and entered to steal property. During the second one, the suspects were interrupted by an employee of the business and fled. We are working on getting the suspects identified. Officers made two self-initiated stops which resulted in narcotics arrests, one for meth and one for fentanyl. During the arrest for meth, the suspect broke a glass pipe and tried to dispose of the drugs as the officer was approaching him. He was additionally charged with attempting to destroy evidence and violation of his probation. An officer responded to a vandalism call where the suspect smashed windows of a car with a baseball bat and then fled. He was identified and wanted now for felony vandalism. This afternoon, officers responded to a family disturbance where an Army veteran was suffering from a mental breakdown from PTSD. He was detained for a mental health evaluation and transported to the hospital by ambulance.
