We were hoping for a peaceful Sunday, but no luck. It was busy all day. One officer was busy most of the day following up with a juvenile runaway case. An officer contacted a male downtown this morning and arrested him for a warrant. This afternoon, officers responded to a family fight which resulted in the mother being arrested for misdemeanor child abuse on her 17-year-old son. Within an hour we received another call of a family fight at the same house where the 17-year-old assaulted his stepdad with a broomstick and the adult daughter threatened to kill her mom with a razor blade. The 17year old went to juvenile hall for assault with a deadly weapon and the adult daughter went to jail for brandishing a weapon and criminal threats. Officers responded to a call of male having a mental health episode, threatening his mother, neighbors and exposing his genitals to people. We located him in the front yard and he tried to flee from officers and jump the fence to his backyard. He was not in good enough shape to do so and was quickly detained. He was transported to the hospital for a mental health evaluation. At the end of the day, an officer investigated a juvenile molest case.
