SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Dayshift officers had a busy day and handled a variety of calls ranging from high-priority criminal activity to routine enforcement. Just before sunrise, officers were involved in a pursuit that originated in the southern end of town and ended in the northern residential district. The driver collided with a residence backyard fence and was taken into custody. He turned out to be DUI and had evidence of selling narcotics. Officers then responded to a weapon violation in which a subject was seen shooting a firearm into the air. Officers responded to the location quickly, but the subjects were gone by the time they arrived. During the day, officers also arrested several subjects for active warrants.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift was busy all evening. Early in the shift, officers arrested two females and one male for warrants on self-initiated stops. The females had misdemeanor warrants and the male was wanted for a previous felony domestic violence incident. Officers investigated two traffic collisions. One involved a solo reckless driver who crashed into two parked cars, a pole and damaged a driveway of a residence. He was cited for multiple violations. Soon after this, a hit & run collision was reported where the suspect driver walked away from the scene. He was not located but DUI was suspected due to alcohol found in the vehicle. Officers responded to a call of a male being assaultive at the Gospel Mission. When they arrived, he left his bike behind and fled on foot. He was located a short distance away, too drunk to care for himself, and in possession of methamphetamine. Due to his life choices, he is currently on parole and had priors for possession of narcotics, which made this one a felony. He went jail for felony possession of meth, public intoxication, and a parole violation. Officers responded to another drunk guy causing a disturbance at an apartment complex. He was trying to drive off on an electric scooter, but family stopped him. Officers located him on the sidewalk, extremely intoxicated and not too friendly. He was arrested for public intoxication and taken to jail to sober up. Later in the shift, several officers assisted in searching for a 57-year-old, missing person. He left his apartment near the college to go for a walk around 3pm this afternoon and did not return home. He was located by an officer after about an hour and a half of searching. He was a bit confused but unharmed, and reunited with family.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift started out busy as several in-progress calls began to come in. After calls slowed, officers worked on several in-custody reports that were generated over the weekend. Last night we also responded to an injury accident at the intersection of W Main and West Ave. The driver collided into a signal light pole at a rapid speed which caused significant damage to the vehicle and pole. A passenger in the vehicle was trapped inside when we arrived and showed obvious injuries. Fire personnel arrived and had to utilize a saw to extract the passenger from the vehicle and he was then transported to a hospital. The female driver showed signs of impairment and a DUI investigation was done. She was eventually arrested for felony DUI and had a BAC over 2x the limit. She was medically cleared at the hospital

and booked into jail.
