SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift was eventful but the events were spaced out nicely. A male was walking on W. Main and recognized by an officer as having warrants. He was stopped and arrested for his five outstanding warrants from Turlock and Merced County. We investigated a death of a

homeless male in a dumpster enclosure with no suspicious circumstances. The coroner responded to take possession of the decedent. Officers responded to a drunk driver reported at Monte Vista Crossings, hitting curbs in the parking lot and driving on the wrong side of the road. She was stopped and arrested for DUI with a .30% blood alcohol content. Luckily, no one was hurt as a result of her poor decision to drive. Officers responded to a disturbance at a residence where a homeless male was drunk and not welcome at his brothers' home. He was found on the sidewalk in front of the home and arrested for public intoxication.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers responded to an assault and battery between boyfriend and girlfriend. The male allegedly punched the victim on the right side of her face. While leaving the residence, the male broke the rear window to the victim's vehicle. The male was not located. An EPO was granted and an I&B for the male's arrest was completed. Officers were also dispatched to a security check at a hotel for a female who was bleeding from the nose. The female was intoxicated and belligerent with officers. The hotel wanted her to leave the property, but she refused. It was determined a little later that the female was actually a male who was transvestite. After checking his real name, he was determined to have non-citable warrants. After a search she was also found in possession of meth. She was booked into jail.
