SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

TPD received a call of a dangerous driver leaving a fast food drive-thru. The pickup had an open tailgate and several tools had fallen out onto the roadway, causing a hazard. The witness followed the driver to a house where the male parked in a driveway. Officers arrived around this time and contacted the male who was obviously intoxicated and admitted to just arriving home. Half way through field sobriety tests, the male became uncooperative and tried to run away. He was taken to the ground and arrested for resisting and a blood draw warrant was obtained due to his unwillingness to provide a sample. He was booked for the DUI and resisting officers. Later in the shift the same officer stopped a vehicle leaving a downtown bar for driving without the headlights on. The driver was determined to be under the influence of alcohol and arrested for DUI. Another officer stopped a male for a bicycle violation. The male had a felony warrant and was found to be in possession of Meth. He was taken to jail. Officers also responded to a domestic disturbance involving an intoxicated husband and his wife. The male believed his wife was hiding another man in the house when he came home and began throwing things around the house looking for the "other man". He shoved his wife into a wall in the process. He was arrested and booked for the battery.
