SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers made numerous traffic stops last night. During one stop, the officer saw open containers of alcohol inside and noticed the odor of alcohol on the driver. Tests were done and the driver was arrested with a BAC of .19%. During another stop, an officer observed the driver swerving and running a stop sign. FST's were done and the driver was arrested with a BAC of .25%. Additionally, officers were dispatched to a strong-arm robbery at a gas station. 4 juveniles entered and took bottles of alcohol. The clerk was shoved out of the way by one of the suspects before they fled from the store. A couple hours later, the same suspects returned for more items. One of the suspects told the clerk to stay behind the counter or he would get punched in the face. The suspects fled again. The area was checked during both incidents, but the suspects were not located. It is believed they went into an unknown, nearby apartment. A BOL was created with surveillance pictures for possible ID.
