SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

This Saturday was pretty busy for dayshift. My officers were busy with calls for service for the majority of the day. Officers made several arrests today, ranging from simple assault, to property damage, to aggravated assault. In the morning hours, officers responded to a subject who was yelling at pedestrians. Parole placed a hold on the subject and he was not happy. He started to bang his head into the rear passenger door of the patrol car when he was placed in it. This caused the door to be bent slightly. He was also charged with the property damage to the patrol car. Later, officers checked on an elderly female who complained about subjects staying in her garage, refusing to leave, and taking advantage of her kindness. They had contacted all subjects and trespassed them from the property about a week ago. When they checked on the residence today, all the subjects were back in the garage. All 4 were arrested. Later in the day, officers investigated a domestic violence incident where a boyfriend was following his girlfriend around town. At one point he threatened to shoot her and he would not leave her alone. He was located and arrested.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Right out of briefing patrol shift responded to Raley's off of Geer road due to the protest of goat products. 10 to 15 protesters had walked into the store and laid down in the store and were causing a disturbance. Officers arrived with day shift holding over. When officers arrived on scene the protesters were all out of the store but in front of the store with megaphones. While speaking with Raley's staff the protesters ended up leaving on their own prior to police even contacting the protesters. Raley's was just happy that they had left the inside of the store. A reported elder abuse in the 1100 block of Las Dalias Ct ended with the suspect being arrested for biting her grandmother. A minor injury accident in the 1000 block of South Avenue kept patrol officers busy in the rain for a bit. A death was also reported in the 4500 block of Fosberg Rd.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

There were not many calls for service last night, but several traffic stops were made. An officer tried to stop a vehicle on the freeway for excessive speed and the driver failed to yield. A pursuit was initiated and after a short chase the driver pulled over. The driver was under the influence of alcohol and was arrested with a BAC of .21%; She was booked. Another made a traffic stop and recognized signs the driver had been drinking alcohol. After conducting tests, the driver was arrested with a BAC of .15% and was booked. During another traffic stop, an officer saw a vehicle doing burnouts in a parking lot. The driver was stopped and he displayed symptoms of intoxication. He also had warrants for DUI and driving on a suspended license. He was arrested with a BAC of .20% and was booked. Lastly, officers were dispatched to a domestic dispute in the early morning hour. A husband and wife had been drinking alcohol and got into an argument. During the argument, the wife threw a glass bottle at her husband, striking him on the back of his head, causing visible injury. The female also scratched the male at some point during the incident, leaving a visible mark on the victim's face.
