Our last work day landed on a Sunday and officers were kept busy all day. We lost an officer early on in the shift due to a felony warrant arrest. He had to get medical clearance due to high blood pressure and sugar. He was at the hospital until about 1500hrs. yesterday officers arrested 4 subjects who were squatting in a garage and refusing to leave. Today we received another call from the victim, stating that some of them were back. We contacted 1 subject in the garage. He was in the middle of using narcotics, so we ruined his high. He was one of the subjects arrested yesterday, so he went back to jail. We also searched for a black vehicle that was reported to be driving erratically. We located the car, and its female driver as she was arriving at her home. She turned out to be DWI. She was also arrested and taken to jail.
