When officers finally caught up to him, it was discovered that he was not who they originally thought he was. However, he still had a warrant. SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The shift provided us with a variety of calls including domestic violence, narcotics, DUI, juvenile runaway, accidents and a shoplifter. It began with a male battering the mother of his child before he left for work. He was not located yet, but once he is, he will be arrested for felony domestic violence. SCU officers did a probation search at a home and arrested two males for narcotics possession. A female shoplifter was arrested at Target. Officers responded to a vehicle vs pedestrian accident involving an 8-year-old child. The child ran out in the street to retrieve his soccer ball and was hit. Thankfully, he only sustained a minor injury to his leg. A female drunk driver collided with two parked cars. Thankfully, she did not hurt anyone with her poor decision this evening. She was arrested for DUI and had a blood alcohol content more than twice the legal limit.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer made a traffic stop on a dangerous driver. The driver displayed signs of intoxication and did poorly on field sobriety tests. He provided a breath sample which showed a BAC of .13%. He was arrested and booked. Officers responded to a 911 security check after a female called two separate times. The first call she stated she was arguing with her ex-boyfriend, but he had left and police were no longer needed. Officers contacted her and she was ok. The second call was about an hour later due to her ex-boyfriend returning. The argument continued and when officers arrived they contacted the male. The male was determined to have a served no-contact protective order against him, protecting the female. He was arrested and booked for violating the order.
