The morning started off with an injury collision in the north portion of town. A pedestrian was struck by a vehicle. The pedestrian was taken to Modesto due to the trauma sustained. The injuries were not life threatening, and the driver was not impaired in any way. Officers also responded to a local clinic for a patient who was making threats of wanting to hurt herself. Apparently, she felt she wasn't being seen quick enough, and this made her feel depressed to the point of wanting to hurt herself. She was placed on a mental health hold.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer saw a male standing at a corner who was acting erratically and displaying strange behavior. The male was contacted and consented to a search after telling the officer he had Meth in his pocket. After locating the drugs, he was placed under arrest. Officers also responded to a domestic disturbance at a residence over child custody. The call came in shortly after a female requested a civil standby, which was denied due to there being no child custody order, and the late hour in which the 11-month-old child was likely asleep and safe with her father. The female decided to go get her daughter anyway and started an altercation with the ex-boyfriend and his new girlfriend. The situation almost turned physical when the couple exchanged the child, as the female tried to swing at the male, but he moved out of the way and she missed. The female left before police arrived and was pulled over a short distance away. Both parties involved, along with witnesses denied a physical altercation. The incident was documented.
