SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Monday brought dayshift a busy day. Officers were spending most of the day tending to calls for service that seemed to just keep popping up. Several of the calls were domestic violence related, and arrests were made on those. TPD received a call of a subject who was asleep in his vehicle, and the owner of the property found a loaded handgun on the trunk lid. It turned out that the subject asleep (owner of the vehicle) was prohibited from possessing a firearm. He was arrested and the handgun was taken for evidence. Officers then responded to a domestic battery in which one of the males was breaking items inside the apartment he shares with his partner. The partner claimed he was struck in the head, and showed the officers a red mark. Officers then arrested the responsible male for domestic violence. Additionally, the arrested subject had a restraining order and he was not to have any contact with his boyfriend.
