SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Calls for service were few last night. With that being said, an officer responded to a report of a juvenile runaway who returned home. The juvenile disclosed she had been taken to the Bay area by a male she met on social media. She reported being forced to have sex and was being held against her will in Oakland. She was taken to the hospital for a sexual assault exam and detectives were notified. The victim was eventually booked into juvenile hall for an outstanding probation violation warrant. Officers also responded to an in-progress disturbance between male and female. The male had a served no-contact restraining order that protected the female. He was arrested and booked for violating the order. While these calls were still actively being investigated and occupying officers, a man with a gun call was dispatched. Several callers reported a male in the neighborhood knocking on doors, going into people's yards, and yelling things. Many of the callers reported seeing the man with a gun, who was wearing all black clothing. All of the callers lost sight of the male and were unable to provide any possible direction of travel. Officers area checked and did not locate the male.
