SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The rainy shift began with a vehicle vs pedestrian traffic collision on W Main St. A 17-year-old male ran out into traffic and was hit by a car. He was transported to the hospital but thankfully sustained only minor injuries. Throughout the night, officers arrested seven

people, six went to jail and one was cited. A male was contacted downtown, drunk on the sidewalk. He was booked for public intoxication. An officer conducted a bike and the rider had a warrant, which he was cited for. A male was drunk and setting off fireworks in his driveway which triggered several 911 calls from neighbors. Officers arrived and contacted him on the sidewalk. He immediately resisted the as they were trying to arrest him for public intoxication. After a brief struggle, they were able to get him in handcuffs. He was booked for public intoxication, resisting arrest and given an \$1,000 administrative citation for his fireworks show. Officers responded to a report of a possible drunk driver. The driver was stopped as he was entering the on ramp of 99. He was indeed drunk and was booked for DUI. Another bike stop was conducted by an officer and this time the rider had a felony warrant so he was booked. Officers responded to report of a male and female fighting. The female was located first and denied any physical fighting occurred. Unfortunately, she had six warrants for her arrest so she was booked. A short time later, officers located a male matching the description of her boyfriend. He ran from officers but was cornered after a short foot pursuit and ordered to the ground. He complied and was taken into custody. He was wanted for previous domestic violence charges. He was booked for resisting arrest and numerous domestic related charges. Other than that, it was quiet.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers were dispatched to the downtown area for a man down in the roadway. When they arrived they located the male, breathing but unresponsive. AMR and transported the male to the hospital. A search of the man's pants revealed some suspected Fentanyl. Officers responded to a disturbance at a residence. A female was outside the home of a male who she was accusing of sexually assaulting her. She arrived at the house with four males who were yelling and banging on the front door. The investigation revealed that earlier in the day, the female and male agreed to have sexual relations via text messages. The male supplied cocaine and invited the female over. She arrived at his house intoxicated and ended up falling asleep on the bed. She reported she woke up to the male trying to put his penis in her mouth. He tried for approximately three minutes and the female continued to tell him to stop. Both parties told a similar story in regards to the oral sex. She wanted the male arrested and he was taken into custody. He was booked for the sexual assault. Officers also responded to a disturbance involving threats. A male with a gun was on the

way to the RP's house and was making threats to use it. Officers did not locate the vehicle or the suspect at that time. A short time later, an officer located the vehicle and made a traffic stop. The driver was searched and found to be in possession of a revolver in his waistband. He was a felon and prohibited from possessing a gun. He was arrested and booked into jail.
