### SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Tonight, was fairly quiet with call for service but we still managed to arrest six people and take five to jail. The first was a homeless male downtown who entered a business to use the

bathroom but was refused. He assaulted the staff and then left. He was located at Central Park and arrested/booked. An officer was patrolling his beat and noticed a male driver, who was a suspect in one of his prior cases. The male was stopped and determined to have a felony warrant for his arrest, so he was booked. SCU was patrolling tonight also and came across a male and female, at separate times, who both had felony warrants. They were both booked. Another female was contacted during a vehicle stop. She had misdemeanor warrant and was cited. Lastly, a drunk male decided to pass out on someone else's porch. He was given a ride to jail to sleep off his drunkenness at a more comfortable location.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

The night became busy towards the end of the shift with domestic violence related calls. One call started as a disturbance on the side of the roadway. A male was reported to have hit his girlfriend's vehicle window with a hammer. During the convoluted investigation, it was determined that the girlfriend had punched the boyfriend two time on his head during their argument. Additionally, there were five children in the vehicle, and all of the involved parties were homeless, living out of their vehicle. After arresting the female for battery, she began making statements of suicide and was found in possession of fentanyl. Officers had to take temporary custody of all the children, as there were no family members to call and take them. This call ran late into the shift and was taken over by dayshift, to await a response from CPS. The female was booked for domestic battery. During the above call, another call came in of a female who is restrained from her child's father. The female went to his house uninvited and refused to leave. During the investigation, that had to be handled with the use of the language translation line, it was determined that a domestic battery also occurred. The female was arrested and booked for violating the court order and domestic violence.
