SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Steady shift throughout the night. Officers responded to an assault and battery where one subject randomly punched another as he was walking near the train tracks and industrial area. The male suspect was contacted and arrested per a Citizen's Arrest for assault and battery. The male was also arrested for public intoxication, a parole hold and assault on a police officer after he charged into an officer during the medical clearance process prior to being booked into jail. TPD received multiple calls regarding a verbal argument between a male and female that was inside of a vehicle and traveling around the city. Officers used law enforcement tools to track the vehicle and ultimately located it near an apartment complex. The female had sustained injuries as was transported to an area hospital for treatment. Through the preliminary investigation, the incident is domestic violence related and officers are still on scene as of this narrative conducting the investigation.
