SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was steady Saturday evening with calls for service. Lots of party and noise disturbance type calls. There were two arrests, both males who went to jail. The first was a child abuse and false imprisonment case where a 17 year old female was abused by her adult brother and prevented from leaving. He was arrested and booked. An Emergency Protective Order

was granted by a judge for the victim and CPS was contacted. The second was a drunk male causing problems at his girlfriends house. When officers arrived he refused to stop when ordered to, and tried to get away. An incoming officer located him a block away and he was arrested after physically resisting. On the way to jail, he began kicking the windows to the patrol car so the officer pulled over and we placed the suspect in the WRAP restraint device before resuming transport. He was booked for public intoxication and resising/delaying a peace officer.
