### SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Today we had a quiet Sunday morning until about noon. Officers responded to a reported brandishing of a gun during an argument. One group showed up to a house in a car looking for a male who was not home. They claiming someone was owed money and an argument ensued. Both groups reported the other group made mention of a gun, before the group in the car fled the area. At one point, we had 2 suspects detained in a car stop, and officers at two other locations with others detained. After interviews, searching a car and apartment, no gun was located, and there was not sufficient evidence to make an arrest. Other than that, officers investigated a fraud case, some trespassing calls, and disturbances.

### SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Sunday was not as busy as the previous days, but officers were still kept busy. In the beginning of the shift TPD received a call from a female who stated she was suicidal. She stated that she had cut her wrists and her throat as well. Officers responded and located her, with cut wrists and throat. The injuries were not life threatening and she was taken to a hospital for treatment of the injuries. She was placed on a 5150 hold. Shortly after that, we received a call for assistance from CHP. They had stopped a vehicle for a road rage incident and the driver was threatening to fight the CHP officer. We arrived and he decided to calm down when multiple officers arrived. Officers also responded to a retail area for numerous cars in the parking lot for a car meet. At one point over 100 cars were present. Several stops were made and citations issued.
