### SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

For the second day in a row, officers responded to a drunk person call at 7am. Yesterday was a half-naked female in the bushes of an apartment complex and today was a fully naked male at the Transit Center under a blanket. The male today happened to be 17 years old, so his father was contacted at work and responded to pick him up. Officers responded to a disturbance call at a park where they contacted a familiar homeless female. She was reportedly harming herself and banging her head on the picnic table. She was detained for a mental health evaluation and transported by ambulance to a hospital. Officers responded to Kohls for a female shoplifter. She was arrested for felony shoplifting, due to her prior convictions, and also for possession of the cocaine found in her property.
