She made suicidal statements while officers and medical staff were trying to calm her down. She was transported by ambulance to the hospital for medical treatment and a mental health evaluation. Late morning brought a call of an adult son being abusive toward his elderly mother and family. The investigation resulted in the son being arrested and booked for elder abuse.
