Today kept with the theme of quiet in the morning and busy the rest of the day. Around 11am, officers responded to a female laying on a sidewalk near a park. She told officers she was from "neverland" and had gotten dropped of from Modesto. She was determined to be under the influence of drugs and unable to care for herself. She was arrested and booked for public intoxication. This afternoon, an officer investigated a stalking case, where the suspect has yet to be located. Additionally, this afternoon, officers responded to an assault/battery at an apartment complex where the victim was jumped by two males. Once officers arrived, the two suspects took off running. One was caught and the other was got away for now. The one we caught was the main suspect in the assault/battery and also had a warrant for his arrest. He was booked for both.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Swing shift's third day on patrol turned out to be a very busy one. Multiple officers had arrests that required the subjects to be booked into jail. The most significant revolved around a subject who was mentally imbalanced. He was seen driving his car through the middle of town, with all his windows covered, blocking both the view into the car, and the driver's ability to view outside. When he was stopped, he stated that he believed that snipers were out to get him, and that was why his windows were covered. He was ordered out of the car, but he refused. As we were speaking with him, he stated that the only way out of the car was with his death. He additionally made threats to officers. He started to reach for items under a stack of clothes that he had on his passenger seat. He was told to stop reaching for items, but he stated that he could do whatever he wanted. After being asked to exit the vehicle several times, he rolled up his window. At that time his window was broken and he was removed from the vehicle. Multiple knives were later located throughout the car.
