SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Wednesday night proved to be a busy one. Officers left from briefing early to respond to an out of control juvenile who was assaulting and threatening staff at a group home. Staff had to restrain him and when we arrived, he was placed on a mental health hold. No injuries were reported by the staff. Officers also responded to a fight between an adult daughter and her father. During the altercation, she threw a phone at him and striking him in the head. Due to the fathers age, she was arrested for elder abuse and taken to jail. Afterwards, TPD received a call from a mother who said her children were missing. She stated that she left her 8 yr old, 5 yr old, and 14-month-old home alone while she left to get her benefit check. She left the 8 yr old with a can of pepper spray and a cell phone to call 911 for emergencies. The children became scared when mom didn't come home and they called a grandparent, who quickly came and recovered the children. A history check showed that she had done something similar 2 other times. This time she was arrested for child neglect and taken to jail.
