SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was busy throughout the shift for Officers. A total of 12 reports were taken. Two calls resulted in arrests for violation of a domestic violence restraining order and an arrest for a domestic battery causing injuries. A male's girlfriend called the police on him for being in her residence in violation of a restraining order. Officers responded to a residence to investigate a disturbance. Both parties had special needs which took longer than normal to investigate and determine there was a crime. That male was arrested and booked for a domestic battery charge.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

An officer contacted a male who appeared to be under the influence of drugs. A records check revealed he had a warrant for his arrest and was booked. An officer contacted two occupants sitting in a parked vehicle with expired registration over a year. Upon contact the officer saw drug paraphernalia on the passenger in plain view. The passenger was issued a citation for the drug pipe and the driver received a citation for the registration. Officers were dispatched for a male who was at a hotel and refusing to leave after being denied a room. After officers cleared the call they were dispatched again to the same location due to the male remaining on the property. A citizen's arrest was requested and the male was arrested for trespassing. During the arrest process the male resisted by pulling away from officers. Once he was taken into custody he was taken to jail. Lastly, an officer contacted two people sitting in a car in the parking lot of a closed business. One occupant had a felony warrant and was arrested. While being searched he was found in possession of Meth and a pipe. The other occupant also had Meth and was arrested. Both of them were booked in jail.
