Graveyard officers handled a late aggravated assault call. The investigating Officer had probable cause to arrest the suspect. He was located by the Newman Police Department. A dayshift Officer assisted in meeting with that Officer, arresting the suspect and booking him into jail. Calls for service were steady most of the morning. The shift became busy when Lowe's called and reported that three males were stealing from the business. As they were leaving in their vehicle, an Officer located it nearby. Upon stopping it in a nearby parking lot, two of the suspects fled on foot. All three were detained and arrested. Two of them went to jail. The stolen property was released back to the business. While this call was in progress, a minor injury accident happened on the other side of town. Calls continued to come in and Swing Shift broke from briefing early to start responding to calls.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Today was keeping with the current trend of it being extremely hot. And along with the heat, the calls for service was high as well. Swing shift officers started handling calls right out of briefing, and it didn't slow down until the end of our shift. Officers detained 2 people today on mental health holds due to them being a danger to others. Officers also contacted a subject at a local park due to him being verbally aggressive with patrons. When he was contacted by the police, he continued with his behavior. He was very intoxicated, and he started to resist when he was being detained. He was successfully arrested without injury and taken to jail. Officers also responded to a female who was harassing her ex boyfriend's family. She was restrained from the home, but today she entered through a window and locked herself in their bathroom. Somehow, she was covered in feces. He was eventually arrested and taken to jail for stalking.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

During a consensual contact a male was arrested for having an outstanding warrant. An officer saw a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and a traffic stop was made. The driver was determined to be under the influence of marijuana and was arrested. A blood draw warrant was obtained and he was taken to jail after stopping by the hospital. An officer drove by the residence of a wanted subject and saw the male in the driveway. The male was contacted and arrested. He was booked on a felony warrant and two misdemeanor warrants. Officers responded to a domestic disturbance after a female called 911 informing her boyfriend was drunk and acting erratic and screaming. When officers arrived, they contacted the female at the door and the male tried to shut the door on officers. After a short struggle the male was detained. The investigation revealed several crimes had occurred. The male had to be placed in a WRAP due to him kicking at officers and refusing to get into a patrol vehicle. He was booked for robbery, domestic battery, preventing someone from calling for help, and possession of cocaine. Lastly, an officer made a traffic stop on a male who had an active felony warrant of arrest for battery causing serious bodily injury. He was booked into jail for the warrant.
