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SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Tonight was Friday night at the fair, and it produced a busy day of swingshift officers. While only 5 reports were taken during this time, several of them were extensive and required multiple officers over an extended time period. In the beginning of the shift, officers responded to a roll over collision near the center part of town. The driver collided with a parked vehicle and flipped his car on its side. He was intoxicated, and taken to jail for DWI. Towards the end of the shift, officers heard a crashing sign form the south sided of the police department. Officers discovered that a vehicle had went over the curb of northbound Lander Ave, continued towards West Olive Avenue, and collided with the short retaining wall south of the police department. The driver was heavily intoxicated. His passenger sustained injuries to his knees, but refused medical treatment. The driver was arrested and taken to jail on felony DWI charges.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Officers made numerous traffic stops last night. With additional officers working the fair, we were able to display a strong police presence downtown where the area had crowds of people at the bars. One of the fair units stopped a vehicle that was involved in a hit & run. The female driver was determined to be intoxicated and had a 1-year-old child in the vehicle. She was arrested for the DUI and child endangerment. An officer saw a female in the middle of a busy intersection, causing a hazard. She was contacted and determined to have a warrant for drugs; She was booked in jail. Officers also responded to a call of a juvenile laying on the sidewalk. He was unresponsive but breathing. The male juvie had blood around his mouth and had a water bottle next to him. The contents of the water bottle were determined to be hard liquor. Officers were unable to identify the male and he was taken to Modesto hospital by AMR. Follow-up will be done once the juvie is alert and able to talk.
