The victim sustained non-life-threatening injuries and received medical treatment at the hospital. The investigation is ongoing.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

A steady shift for nights with self-initiated activity and calls for service. A weapon offense that occurred kept several officers occupied for a few hours. This call involved an angry intoxicated male who decided to carelessly shoot his gun into the ground and into the air several times while in front of his residence and on the street. After leaving in a car officers located him and a high-risk traffic stop was done. The male was detained, but no firearm was found in the vehicle. At the residence, officers located several spent casings in the road, along with frightened family members who provided statements to officers. A search warrant was obtained for the male's bedroom and two firearms were recovered. One of the firearms appears to be the one used in the shooting. He was arrested and booked for unlawful discharge of a firearm, along with child endangerment and for making threats to a family member. Officers arrested a male for burglary after the male broke a window to a residence and climbed through it. While inside the residence he made himself a sandwich. An officer also saw a male he recognized and believed to have a felony warrant. The male was booked into jail after the warrant was confirmed.
