SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

Busy Friday night with several officers making numerous traffic stops resulting in four DUI arrests. An officer contacted a male who was on PRCS. The officer called the probation officer and learned the male was out of compliance for failing to check in. Probation wanted the male arrested for the violation. He was arrested and booked. As the same officer was on the way to the jail, he heard several gun shots being fired near his location. Nearby was a large party occurring at an address in a county pocket, where the shots were believed to be coming from. Every officer responded and encountered over 200 unruly people that were out in the roadway. Stan County was notified and several deputies responded. With heavy police presence the scene was able to be safely managed. The Sheriff's Department handled the investigation while TPD officers provided scene security. There were no reported gunshot victims and information obtained suggested that two groups of males were shooting at each other. Officers also responded to a larceny that occurred at a gas station. The suspect was located and determined to be a juvenile female who was on probation. She lied about her name and decided to run from officers during the investigation. Officers detained her after a short foot chase and determined her real name. Additionally, she was heavily under the influence of alcohol. Juvenile Hall advised they would not accept her, so officers had to cite her out to an adult family member for theft, false ID, resisting/obstructing, and public intoxication.
