It was a very active swing shift for my crew. In addition to the calls for service, the Melon Festival was ongoing. Although we had officers assigned to monitor that activity, and not many calls for service were a result of the festival. During swing shift, several arrests were made and the arrestees were subsequently taken to jail. During this shift, officers

responded to a retail store and started an investigation for a strong-armed robbery. A subject was shoplifting, and when he was approached by Loss Prevention, the suspect struck him with the shopping cart. The subject then fled, leaving the cart and merchandise behind. Officers also responded to 2 domestic batteries. One of the suspects was still on scene and was arrested, the other had fled prior to TPD arrival.

SUPERVISOR COMMENTS

It was a busy Saturday night with minimum staffing. Officers made a total of six arrests, responded to multiple disturbance type calls, and ten reports were taken. When time allowed, officers made several traffic stops and contacted suspicious persons. An officer contacted a male walking and obtained consent to a search. The male was found in possession of meth and a pipe. He had several prior drug convictions and was booked for a felony. Another officer consensually contacted a male walking. A records check showed he had an active warrant and was arrested. Officers also responded to two different mental illness calls within ten minutes apart. One call was an assist for AMR on the freeway, who had a combative patient in the rig trying to jump out. The other call involved a male at an EMC emergency room who started yelling and threatening other patients and staff. Both calls resulted in 5150 evaluation holds being placed.
