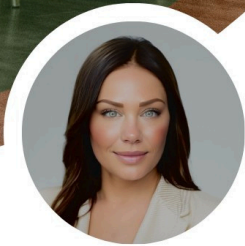

Executive Summary – March 2026 Monthly Report

Key Highlights

- **Sustained Development Momentum:** Multiple commercial and industrial projects are advancing, including continued discussions with national retailers, expansion of existing businesses, and new tenant commitments across key corridors.
- **Economic Development Strategic Plan Adopted:** The City Council formally adopted the 2026 Economic Development Strategic Plan, establishing a clear, data-driven roadmap for future growth and investment.
- **Turlock Development Incentive Program Approved:** City Council approved the Turlock Development Incentive Program, providing a 25% reduction in Capital Facilities Fees (CFF) to help spur new development, assist business attraction, and support business expansion.
- **Strong Business Retention Engagement:** Business Retention & Expansion (BRE) efforts continue to gain momentum, strengthening relationships between the City and local employers while providing direct insight into business needs and opportunities.
- **The Turlock Business Conference** has generated significant interest, reflecting continued demand for economic insight, networking, and business resources.
- **Job Market Trends Monitored:** Recent labor market data reflects continued job growth alongside signs of moderating hiring activity and declining labor force participation, highlighting a stable yet evolving employment landscape.

Summary:

Economic Development activity for March 2026 reflects continued momentum across business attraction, retention, and strategic planning efforts. Business Retention & Expansion (BRE) activity continues to grow, fostering stronger relationships between the City and local employers while providing valuable, real-time insight into business needs, challenges, and expansion opportunities.

Several key development projects are advancing alongside new tenant activity, demonstrating ongoing private sector confidence in Turlock’s market. The adoption of the 2026 Economic Development Strategic Plan, along with the approval of the Turlock Development Incentive Program, marks significant progress in establishing a clear framework and tools to support future growth and investment.

Overall, the City is strengthening its economic foundation through proactive engagement, strategic planning, and targeted programs that support business growth and long-term economic vitality.

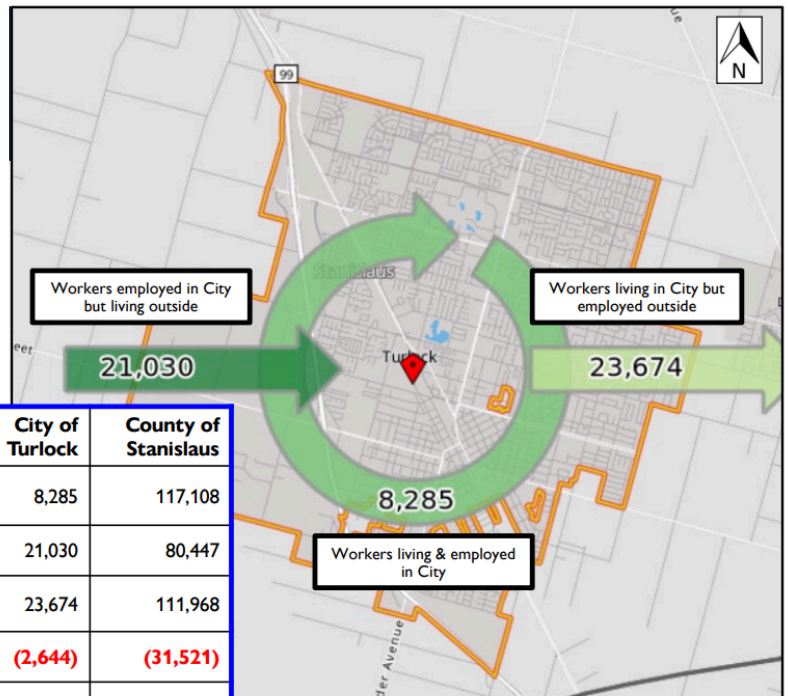

Business Retention and Expansion (BRE)

Business Retention and Expansion (BRE) plays a vital role in economic development by prioritizing the needs of existing businesses within the City. These businesses serve as the backbone of the local economy, driving job creation and economic resilience.

Through proactive engagement and support, BRE initiatives help businesses address challenges, capitalize on growth opportunities, and remain competitive, ultimately reinforcing the City's economic stability and reducing the likelihood of business closures.

During the month of March 2026, City of Turlock Economic Development staff completed 14 Business Retention and Expansion meetings, as well as completed 27 Business Attraction meetings.

Workforce development within economic development refers to a set of strategies and activities designed to enhance the skills, knowledge, and capabilities of the local labor force to meet current and future economic and industry needs.

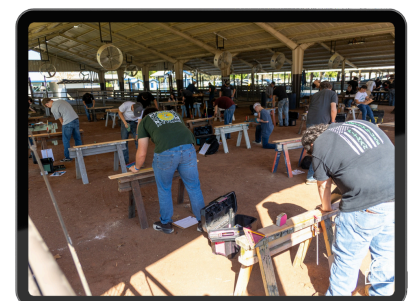
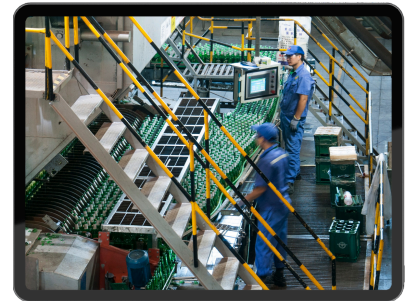
It is an important element of economic development because a well-trained and adaptable workforce is vital for attracting and retaining businesses, fostering innovation, and driving economic growth.

Economic Development staff attended two workforce and talent development events in March, reinforcing the City's commitment to supporting a strong local talent pipeline.

At the Stanislaus State Reverse Career Fair, staff engaged with STEM students presenting innovative research and projects, highlighting the value of industry partnerships like the City's involvement with the STEM CRU program.

Staff also attended the 40th Annual Occupational Olympics & Career Exposition, where students from across Stanislaus County demonstrated real-world skills in fields such as robotics, const, and culinary arts. Both events showcased the importance of Career Technical Education (CTE) and higher education partnerships in preparing a skilled workforce aligned with regional industry needs.

These efforts support long-term economic growth by connecting local students to career pathways and future employment opportunities within the region.

March 2026 Jobs Report Summary

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, the U.S. economy added approximately 178,000 jobs in March 2026, following a revised decline of 133,000 jobs in February, reflecting continued volatility in monthly employment trends.

The U.S. unemployment rate edged down to 4.3%; however, this decline was accompanied by a decrease in labor force participation, indicating fewer individuals actively seeking employment.

Job growth was led by sectors such as healthcare, construction, and transportation, while government and financial activities experienced declines. Overall, the report suggests a labor market that remains stable but uneven, with signs of moderating hiring momentum and workforce participation.

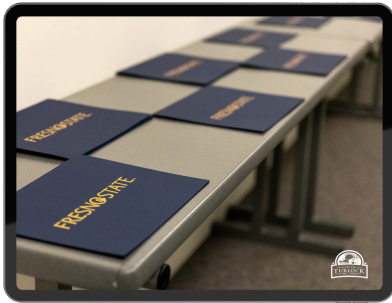

Business Attraction

Attraction strategies within economic development are designed to draw new businesses, industries, and investments to a region. These strategies typically involve a combination of marketing, incentives, infrastructure development, and partnership-building to create a compelling case for businesses to relocate or expand.

The City of Turlock Development Incentive Program was approved by Turlock City Council on March 10, 2026, and is designed to encourage new investment and accelerate commercial, retail, and industrial development throughout the community. The program offers a 25% reduction in Capital Facilities Fees (CFF) for eligible projects, helping reduce development costs and improve project feasibility. It supports job creation and economic growth while being automatically applied to qualifying projects, streamlining the process for developers. The program is available for new construction and select development projects while funding remains available.

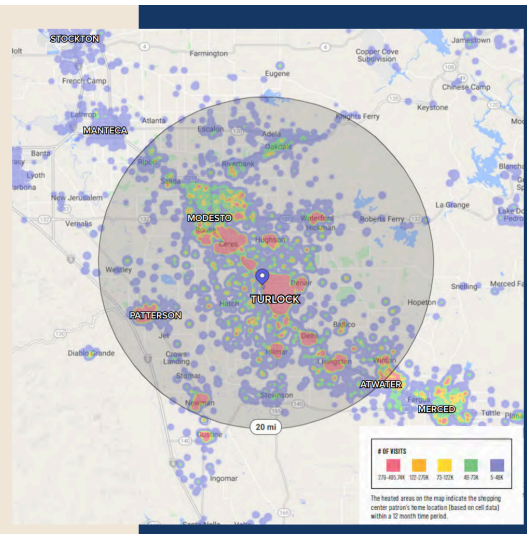

On March 10, 2026, the Turlock City Council formally adopted the updated 2026 Economic Development Strategic Plan, providing a comprehensive and data-driven roadmap to guide the City's economic growth efforts.

The plan outlines key Strategic Priorities focused on business retention and expansion, targeted attraction, workforce development, and continued investment in priority areas such as the Westside Industrial Specific Plan (WISP) and retail development. It also incorporates market analysis, community input, and regional economic trends to ensure the City remains competitive in attracting and retaining businesses. The adoption of the plan reflects Council's commitment to proactive and strategic economic development.

Following adoption, staff is actively developing a detailed implementation plan that will translate the Strategic Priorities into actionable steps, timelines, and measurable performance metrics. The implementation plan will be structured in phased approaches to ensure steady progress over the next several years. Staff anticipates bringing the implementation plan forward to City Council in the coming months for review and direction.

2026 Data Center Marketplace Report (Colliers)

Data centers have emerged as one of the fastest-growing segments in commercial real estate, driven by increasing demand for cloud computing and artificial intelligence infrastructure.

According to Colliers, the sector attracted approximately 31% of global real estate investment in 2025, signaling its transition from a niche asset class to a core component of the digital economy. Demand continues to outpace supply in many markets, resulting in low vacancy rates and heightened competition for sites with access to power, land, and fiber connectivity.

At the same time, rapid expansion is creating challenges related to energy consumption, infrastructure capacity, and long-term sustainability.

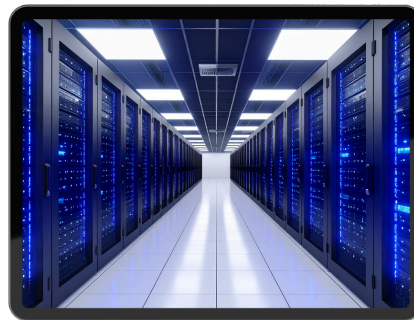
Overall, the report positions data centers as a high-growth opportunity that requires strategic planning and significant infrastructure investment to support continued expansion.

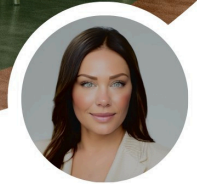

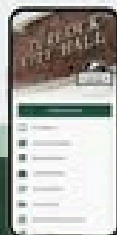

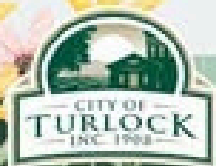

These sessions provide structured opportunities for staff to engage in strategic activities that foster professional growth, strengthen communication and collaboration, and align departmental efforts with the City’s broader organizational goals. The program also supports the development of leadership competencies, promotes a culture of continuous improvement, and reinforces the City’s commitment to high-quality public service.

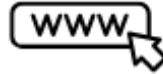
